### NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Notice is hereby given that for the purpose of pre-qualification, Responsibility Questionnaires for Facilities maintenance Projects will be received by the San Luis Obispo County Community College District, ("District") in the Facilities Office, **P.O. #### **Bid Description**

"Informal Bidding" prequalification list prequalifies contractors for projects maintenance and/or construction projects **up to \$175,000**. All contractor prequalification approval is subject to the requirements of the prequalification application. District reserves the right not to perform projects at particular campuses.

#### **Project Requirements**

Contracts over \$25,000 will require a 100% performance bond, a 100% labor and materials bond, and bidder may be required to furnish a bid bond in the amount of 10% of the submitted bid. All projects are subject to the State Labor Code and the District's Labor Compliance Program. For questions regarding the State Labor Code refer to Sections 1735, Discrimination of Employment and 1770, 1773, 1773.11 Prevailing Rates of Wages. Contractors who have been pre-qualified may be required to submit certifications of compliance with the procedures for implementation of the Disabled Veterans Business Enterprise Contracting Goals. Contractors are allowed according to PCC sec. 22300 to submit "securities of lieu of retention". In order to bid, contractors must possess a current and active license to perform the work listed for their specific trade, register with the California DIR, submit the required Responsibility Questionnaire and subsequently be pre-qualified.

Note that the prequalification process does not constitute an agreement, nor is it an obligation to enter any agreements.
